We're both natural talkers and my visits to drop-off stamps usually lasted well over an hour as we just enjoyed spending time sharing our interests and experiences. We'd talk so much that it got to be kind of joke with our respective wives having to pry us apart to keep us on track with other responsibilities. I've always enjoyed spending time with people like Johnny who are honest, interesting across wide range of topics, and listens to other ideas. I now wish I had taken notes on our conversations as I'd like to recount the many good deeds he's done over his life. It was very common form him to do things that made a big difference is people's lives.

In my time talking with Johnny, I came to learn that just about every stamp dealer west of Rockies considers him a personal friend, mentor, or father figure. It is a testament to just what a kind, gentle, caring, giving and loving sole he had.

Presidents Message

Whether you want to say you like the plan or you'd like to see things done differently, I'm listening. It will also take members getting involved to help organize the events we choose to do.
